F. New Business:

1) Motion to create an election committee; Mr. Marc Cohen

The Board of Directors election of 2005 was fundamentally fair and unbiased; however, there are changes that the Election Committee suggested for the next election that would make the balloting even more fair and equitable. These changes were detailed in my last report to the Board, so I will not go into them a second time.

Given the criticism that was launched during and after the election of what was called a flawed process, I would like to put a motion on the floor for the open Board meeting scheduled for July 14th at 5:00 PM as follows:

I move that the Board of Directors cause and appoint an independent committee to review the current bylaws with regard to the USJA election process. The committee is charged with making recommendations to the Board to improve the bylaws and rules for voting so as insure that there is

- 1) one vote for every member of the USJA. Also, that the voting protocol be constructed in such a way to
- 2) insure that the balloting is done in a manner that will insure that there is no undue block voting or
- 3) improprieties of any kind.
- 4) That the Committee will report its findings and recommendations no later than 4 one year after it is created or no later than January 1, 2008.

- a) History of USJA membership
- b) rank histories
- c) history of certifications
- d) committee activities
- e) other information deemed pertinent by the individual

Such history shall include but not be limited to dates of achievement and/or activity in accordance with USJA records.

Participation in such display shall be optional. Participation in such display shall be offered to all members of the current Board of Directors, Promotion Committee, Ethics Committee, Committee Chairpersons and members as well as USJA Master Rank Examiners.

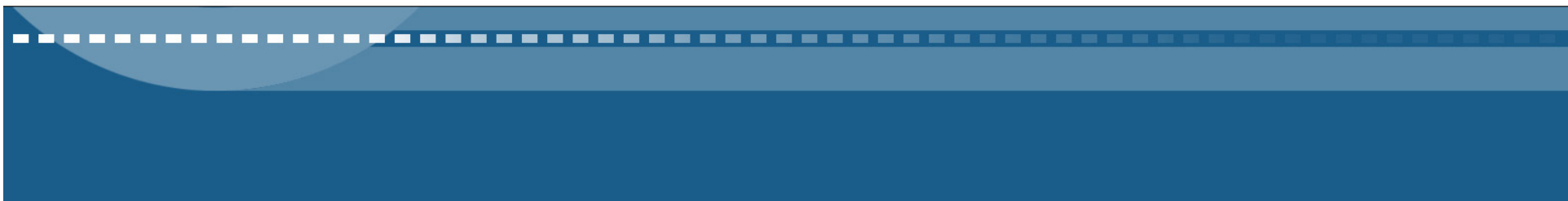
COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES

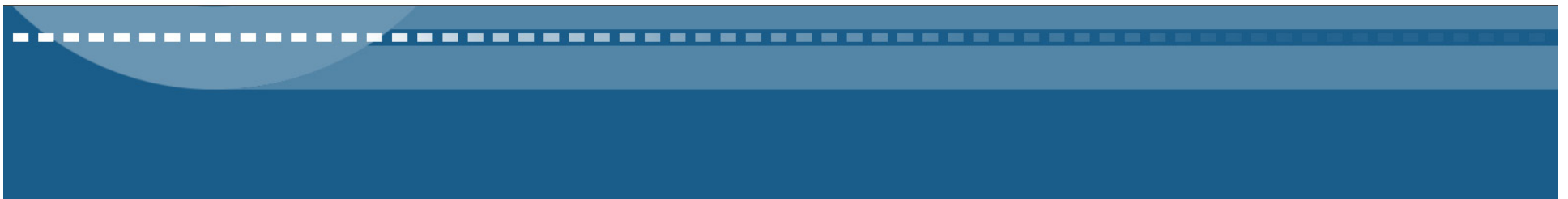


FUTURE PLANS

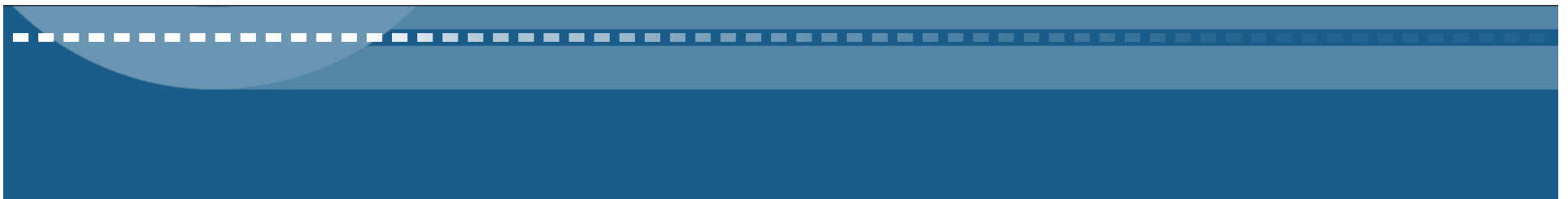




COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES

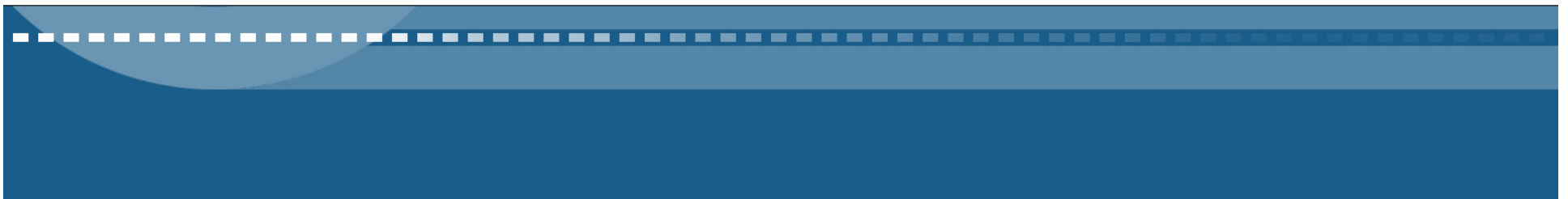
We are currently negotiating with one web-hosting service and a second private college to offer on-line courses for coach certification. These would provide continuing education units in such areas as:

Social and historical foundations of sport

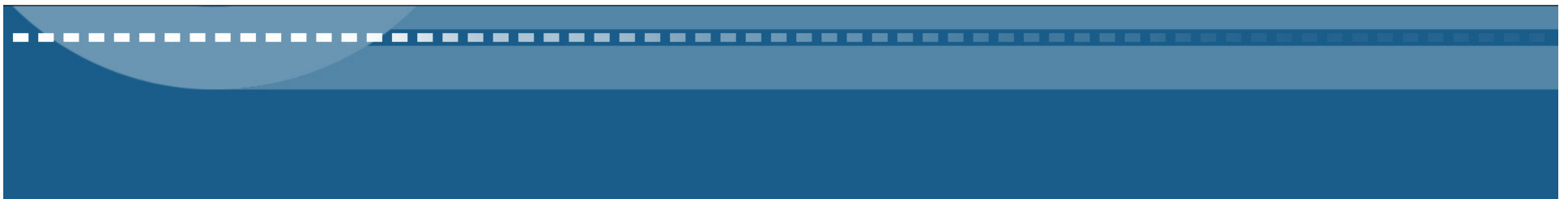




COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES

We have been working with the Women's Committee in three ways:

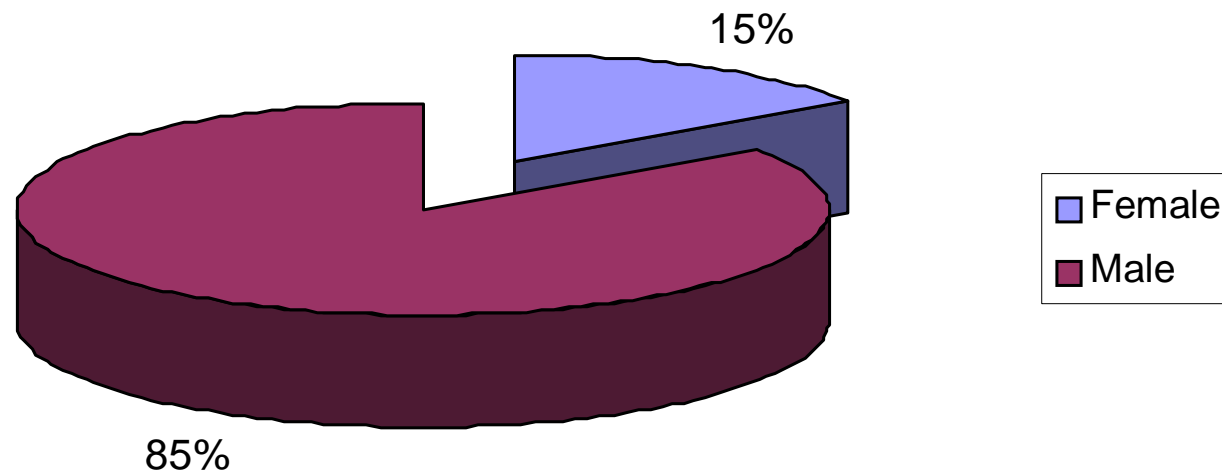
Active Annual Members (5675 as of 6/30/06)



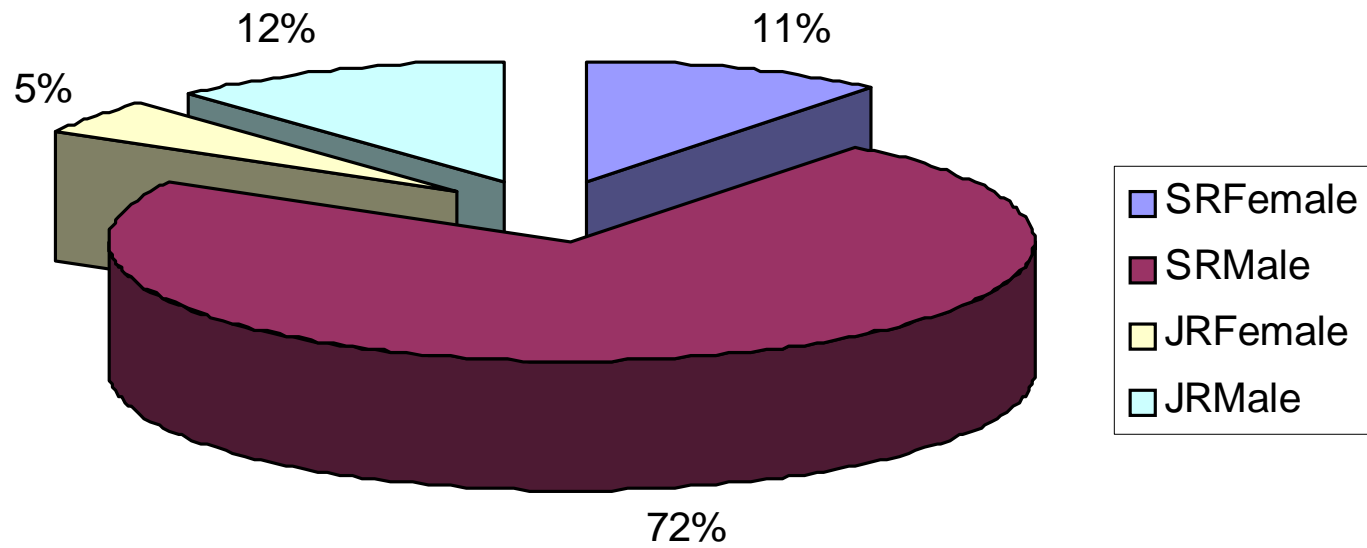
Active Annual Srs and Jrs

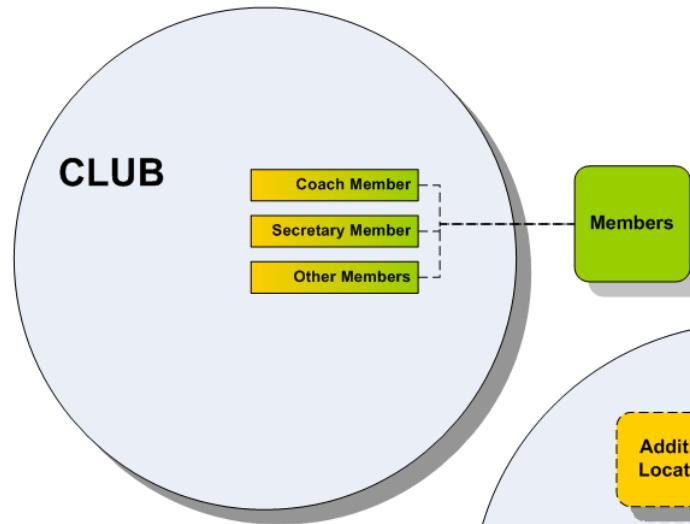

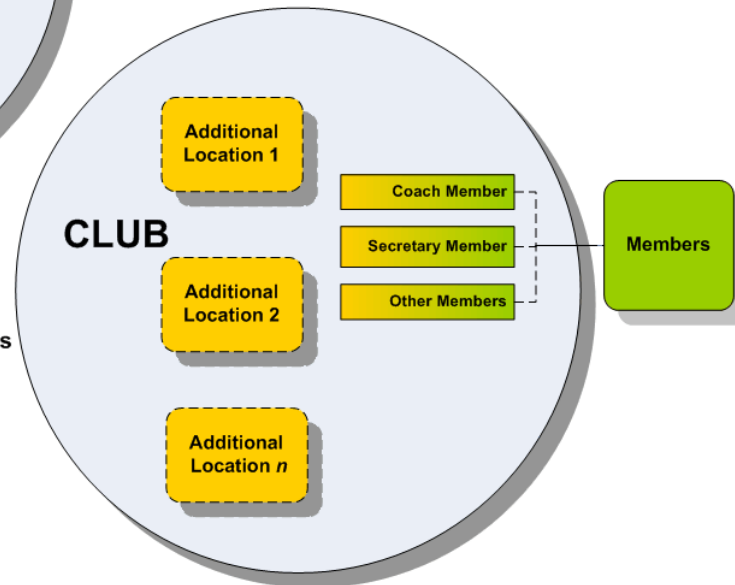

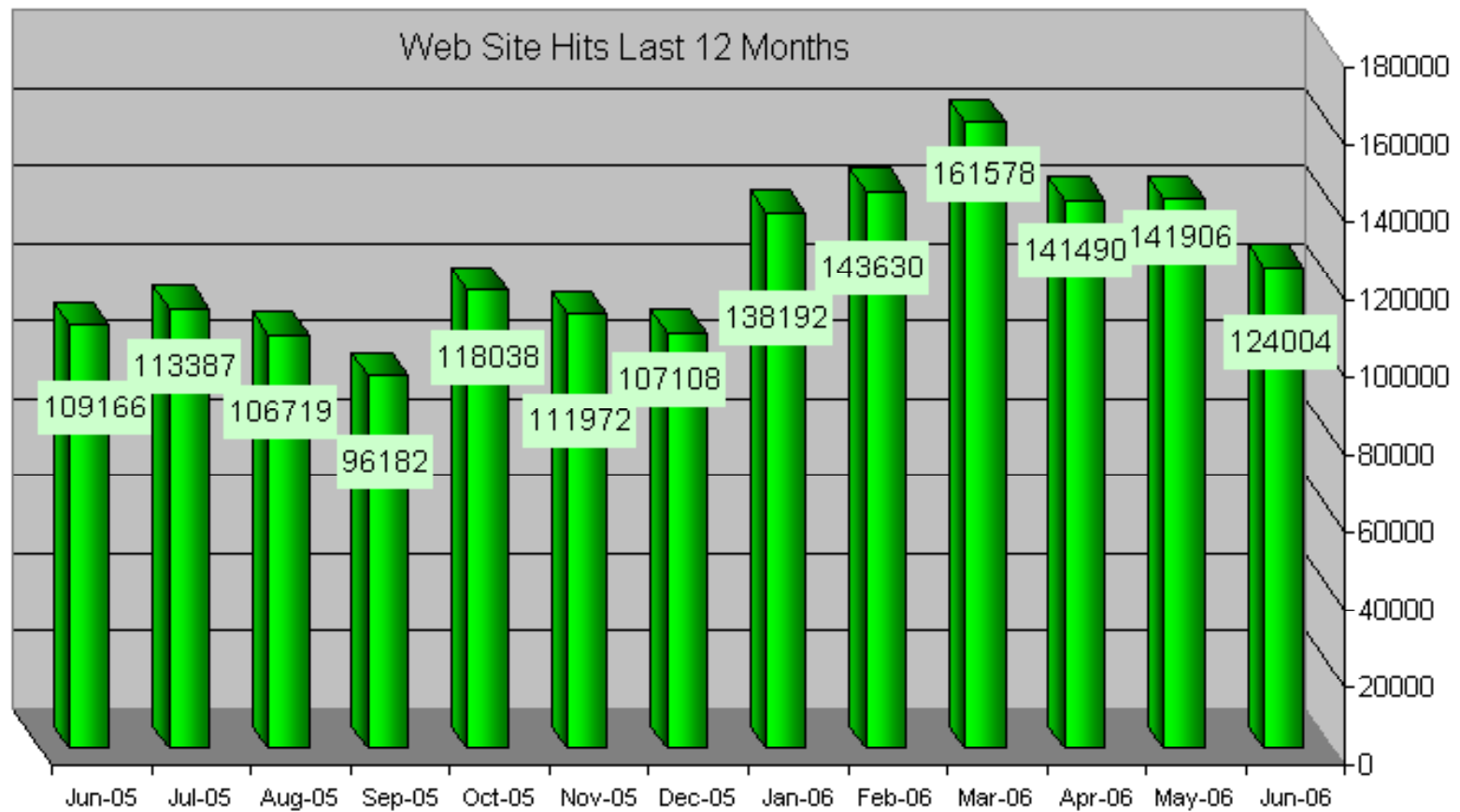
